KYLE SNOW NAMED HEALTHCARE TRUSTEE OF THE YEAR

September 12, 2013—Kyle Snow, chair of Uintah Basin Medical Center’s Board of Trustees in Roosevelt, was recently awarded the 2013 Rural Hospital Trustee Service Award by the Utah Hospital Association. The award, presented during the Association’s Fall Leadership Conference at Zermatt Resort in Midway, recognizes individuals who have made significant contributions to Utah’s healthcare sector while serving as a community trustee.

During Snow’s tenure on the board, Uintah Basin Medical Center (UBMC) has seen a threefold growth in its operations. Snow’s leadership and finance skills have helped the facility to manage the intense growth while providing the community with top quality healthcare services. Kyle comes from a long line of Snows committed to UBMC’s mission. He is the third generation of the Snow family to serve as a UBMC board member.
